Topics

Analyse the "New Highlanders" phenomenon,

- in the context of population movements, especially in-/out migration and multilocality,
- its underlying causes and factors,
- the resulting changes in the structure and composition of the population, and the regional population densities
- the interaction of immigrants and multilocal dwellers with the autochthonous local communities

Aims

- Summarise the state of the art of current knowledge and ongoing research
- Provide inputs to the Working Group "Demography and Employment" of the Alpine Convention (WG DE) and **optional** to the 5th Report on the State of the Alps (RSA 5)
- Prepare new transnational projects and cooperation

Procedure, results

- Based on short themed inputs, a series of topic-specific questions will be discussed in World Cafés
- The results will be taken up by the Working Group "Demography and Employment" and be summarised in a scientific article and published in an appropriate journal. If possible, project proposals will be developed after the workshop.

Participants, costs, language

The number of participants is limited to 25 persons. There are no registration fees. Meals will be offered by ISCAR, while travel and accommodation costs have to be covered by the participants (except input speakers). The language of the workshop will be English.
